FIELDS OF VIEW LAUNCH

Local artists were thrilled with the official launch of group exhibition "Fields of View" and new arts movement environmental expressionism at Parliament House in Melbourne on Friday, February 5.

Opposition Leader Ted Baillieu launched the exhibition featuring the works of Leonie Ryan of Nilma North, Kerrie Warren of Crossover, Peter Biram of Gembrook and Ursula and Werner Theinert of Callignee in front of 60 VIP guests.

Kerrie Warren said the launch was "really wonderful" and was thrilled the group had received an offer to return in

two years with a bigger environmental expressionism exhibition. Peter Biram spoke about the formalisation of the environmental expressionism movement which he believes will help stimulate discussion and deeper understanding of complex environmental issues.
